

Rasuwa-Bhotekoshi Flood: Search, Rescue and Relief Response

Situation Report # 18



Date: 19 September 2026 Time: 07:00PM

This report has been prepared by the NDRRMA based on information received from DAO and District/National Emergency Operation Centers. It summarizes the response actions undertaken for search, rescue, and relief management following the Rasuwa-Bhotekoshi flood situation.

Highlights

- Across 19 health facilities, 344 patients have received treatment: 290 have been discharged, 18 remain under treatment, 32 have been referred to other hospitals, and four have died during treatment. The 18 patients remaining under treatment are at Tribhuvan University Teaching Hospital (eight), National Trauma Center (three), Paropakar Maternity and Women's Hospital (three), Patan Academy of Health Sciences (two), Shree Birendra Hospital (one) and B&B Hospital (one).
- Following site inspections, the Rasuwa District Security Committee and project management decided that further search and rescue operations are not currently required at Langtang and Chilime hydropower projects.
- A total of 1342 affected people are sheltering in holding centres: 794 in 9 centres in Rasuwa, 427 in 11 centres in Nuwakot, and 121 in 4 centres in Dhading.
- The NDRRMA Situation Room maintains daily contact with local governments and wards to prepare municipality report cards covering current conditions and identified needs.
- The Monsoon Response Command Post decided to ensure the quality of food items distributed as relief, determine the land and house models for temporary housing, accelerate efforts to restore connectivity, and streamline warehouse management.
- A joint meeting between the Mobilization Team formed for the coordination of search, rescue, and relief following the Rasuwa-Bhote Koshi flood and the thematic ministries (cluster leads), an understanding was reached to eliminate duplications and bring consistency to the records of missing persons post-Rasuwa flood, as well as to expedite early recovery and rehabilitation efforts.



Search and Rescue Operations

Update: Ongoing Search and rescue operations at different hydropower projects sites.

Project Name	Actions Taken
Rasuwadadhi Hydropower Project (120 MW)	- A joint team comprising the CQRT (Collapsed Structure Search and Rescue Team) and project representatives successfully reached the powerhouse, transformer room, and control room. - Search efforts conducted in and around the powerhouse area yielded no traces or findings. - Search and rescue operations are ongoing. - Heavy equipment is required to continue search and rescue operations; however, transportation remains difficult due to the geographical terrain.

Project Name	Actions Taken
Langtang Hydropower Project (20 MW)	- A joint Nepal Army and Chinese DART team searched approximately 170 metres inside the project tunnel using a thermal drone. Nothing was found. - Manual clearance has reached 170 metres, with 30 metres remaining. - Following a site inspection by representatives of the Rasuwa District Security Committee and the project head, the committee and the project's Managing Director determined that further search and rescue operations are not currently required. - The project company will undertake debris removal at the powerhouse. Security personnel will remain deployed to provide the necessary security.
Chilime Hydropower Project (22 MW)	- Debris has been cleared from 80 metres of the tunnel. Water pumping is reported as ongoing. - Following a site inspection, the District Security Committee and project management determined that further search and rescue operations are not currently required.
Upper Trishuli-1 Hydropower Project (216 MW)	- A 5-member team from the Nepal Army, along with project representatives, conducted a search up to 200 meters inside Audit 1 Tunnel at Hakubeshi; however, nothing was found. - Search and rescue operations were carried out using Thermal Drones at Audit 3 of Upper Trishuli. - A Korean team conducted drone reconnaissance (recke) over the office and residential areas. - A 1,200-meter section of the track connecting Audit 3 to Audit 1 was cleared. - A joint team of the Nepal Army and Chinese personnel conducted manual search operations inside Audit 3 of the project site. - The main body of an excavator was transported to the project site using a Nepal Army aircraft. - Dead bodies were found trapped within the rebar mesh structure (prepared for concrete lining) inside Audit 3 Tunnel at Hakubeshi; 6 bodies were recovered using 3 grinders, 1 gas cutter, and 2 rotary rescue saws. - After cutting steel reinforcement using grinders, gas cutters, and rotary rescue saws, approximately 2,000 meters of the tunnel was cleared, and 31 bodies were recovered; plans are in place to transport 13 of these bodies from Audit 3 to Trishuli on Ashwin 4. - Steel-cutting operations are ongoing to continue the Search and Rescue (SAR) efforts.
Trishuli 3A Hydropower Project (60 MW)	- Search operations were conducted in the tunnel and powerhouse areas; however, nothing was recovered. - Due to continuous rainfall, mud and debris slid around the tunnel entrance, blocking it by approximately 4 feet, and clearance work was carried out. - A joint team comprising security personnel and project representatives conducted search operations in the tunnel, powerhouse, and surrounding areas, but nothing was found. - Search and rescue operations are continuously ongoing.
Trishuli 3B Hydropower Project (37 MW)	- Excavation carried out continuously up to a depth of approximately 2 meters below the riverbed level revealed the foundation of the project's office building; however, no structures of the residential area (Buildings A1, A2, B1, B2, and D) were found. - Water continues to flow at the tunnel inlet; Audit 1 has been cleared up to 476 meters, and Audit 2 has been cleared up to 2.7 km. - Excavation at the powerhouse location yielded no findings. - Excavation work along the wall/flank area of the powerhouse is currently ongoing.

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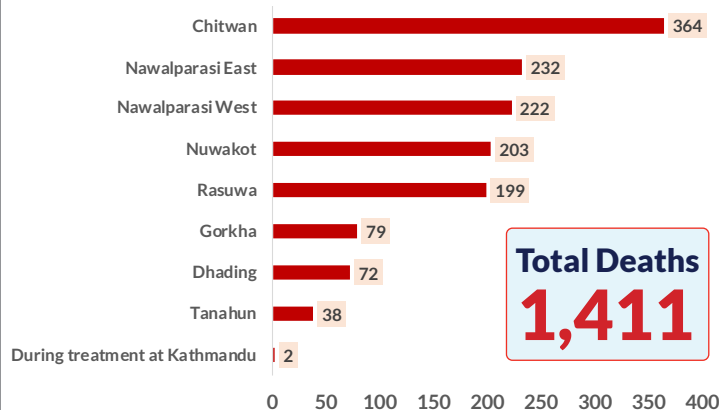

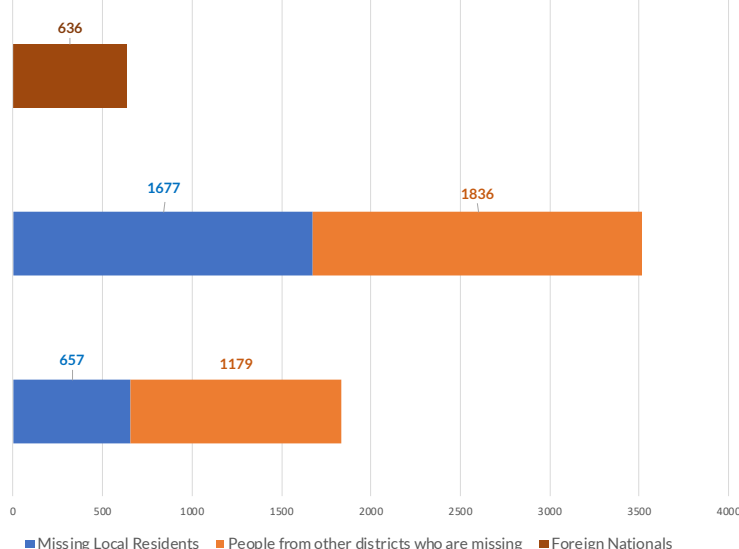

Alternative Housing and Livelihood Grant

- For families unwilling to stay in holding centers, a monthly allowance for accommodation and livelihood will be provided until alternative housing is arranged, for a maximum period of six months, at a rate of **NPR. 15,000** per family (for up to four members) plus an additional **NPR. 2,000** per member for any members exceeding that number.

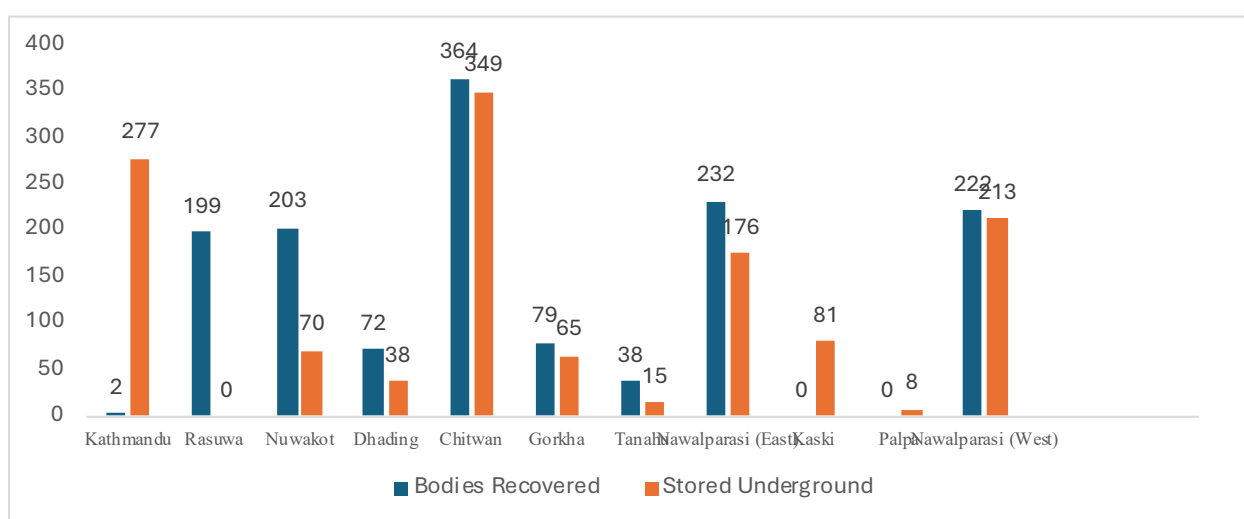

Debris Clearance

- Devghat: Three excavators, three backhoe loaders and three tippers are deployed.
- Dhunge: Three excavators, two backhoe loaders and two tippers are deployed.
- Trishuli: One excavator and one tipper are deployed.
- Galchhi: Two excavators and one tipper are deployed.

Standard operating procedures for debris management and removal, a joint site visit, and a framework for immediate, short-term and long-term rehabilitation and reconstruction

Roads, Bridges, and Transportation Sector

1. Prithvi Highway

- Mugling–Malekhu Section: Two-way traffic resumed at Krishnabhir at 06:00 on 17 September. Traffic at Jyamireghat–Chaukibhir resumed on the morning of 18 September after being interrupted the previous evening.
- The proposed alternative route through Fisling Bridge to Benighat Bridge remains under

procurement. Construction has yet to begin.

- Traffic at Shital Bazaar remains restricted to one lane. Hard-rock blasting is underway in the Shital Bazaar (Krishnabhir) area following completion of the required procedures and a request for Nepal Army support.

Alternative Routes - Kathmandu Access:

- Abukhaireni–12 Kilo–Masane Thanti–Khahare–Nibel–Gyampeshal–Arughat–Salyantar–Dhadingbesi–Parewatar–Gajuritar–Mastar–Kathmandu.
- Abukhaireni–12 Kilo–Masane Thanti–Khahare–Nibel–Gyampeshal–Arughat–Salyantar–Dhadingbesi–Sunaulabazar–Kalleri–Mastar–Kathmandu.
- Abukhaireni–12 Kilo–Masane Thanti–Khahare–Nibel–Gyampeshal–Arughat–Benighat–Kathmandu.

2. Tribhuvan Highway

- Traffic is operating in one lane following landslides near Nagdhunga and Pataleban. Traffic is also operating through the Nagdhunga Tunnel.

3. Galchhi–Devighat–Dhunge–Trishuli Section

- The Galchhi–Devighat, Devighat–Dhunge and Dhunge–Trishuli sections are clear and operational. Kolphu Bridge remains open to one-lane traffic following minor repairs.
- Road excavation and track opening have been completed along approximately 100 metres of road washed away by river erosion at Ratamate, reopening the section to traffic.
- Deposits approximately two to three metres thick have been removed at Thulokhola, restoring traffic. Debris clearance has also been completed along Thulokhola–Kashitar–Devighat. Traffic is operating from Galchhi through Devighat to Battar, Bidur, Trishuli and Gerkhu.

4. Bidur–Betrawati Section

- Of the 10-kilometre section, 9.2 kilometres are clear. The remaining 0.8 kilometres were completely washed away, including 0.5 kilometres requiring cutting through hard rock. Road formation and graveling continue, with preparations for blasting in coordination with the Nepal Army.
- Landslides and soft, waterlogged ground continue to affect work on the new and existing tracks.
- Foundation excavation is underway for the Betrawati Bailey bridge.

Bhainse–Betrawati Section

- Approximately 2.5 kilometres of track opening has been completed. Widening to six metres and graveling continue, alongside the installation of Hume pipes and construction of earthen drains where required.
- Rock cutting continues along the remaining approximately 300 metres between Uttargaya School and Betrawati Bridge.
- Debris clearance continues along approximately 500 metres towards Betrawati, where deposits reach three to four metres in places.
- The Betrawati Bailey bridge design is complete and foundation works have begun.
- On 18 September, components for the Betrawati Acrow bridge were loaded at the Nepal Army's No. 28 Brigade in Bara. Transport is being coordinated with the Department of Roads.

5. Alternative Routes Connecting Dhading and Rasuwa

- Dhading: The Dhadingbesi–Parewatar–Nepaltar–Gajuritar–Piplatar–Adamtar–Belintar–Keurinitar–Mastar route connecting to the Prithvi Highway is operational. Road access to the district headquarters has been restored, and maintenance continues.
- Rasuwa: The Dhikure–Phedi Besi Chowk–Hiramunitar–Chogte–Bore Bhanjyang–Sano Khola–Dhanswara–Bhorle–Jibjibe–Bogatitar route is operational, providing alternative access while the Trishuli–Betrawati highway section remains damaged. Maintenance continues.

6. Alternative to Devighat Bridge and Trishuli River Right-Bank Section

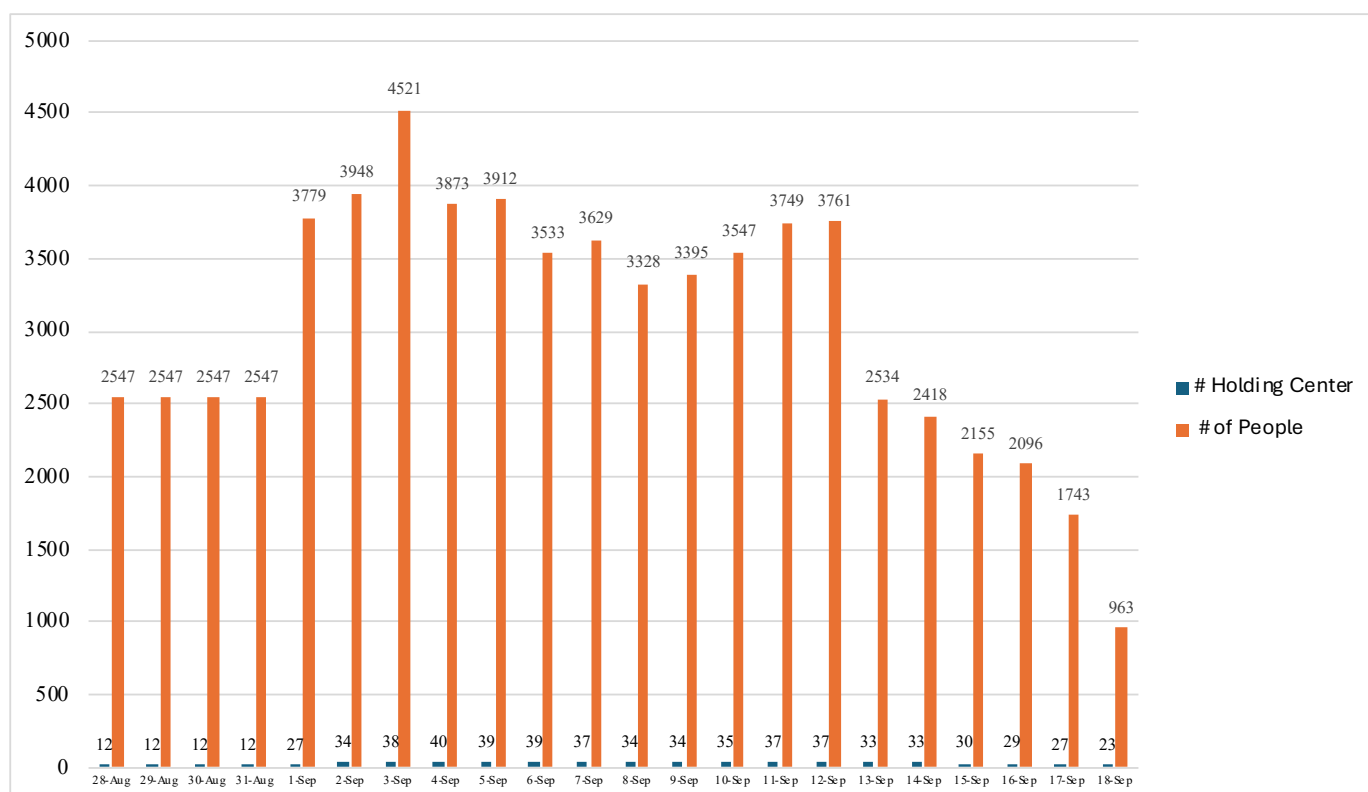
- Alternative to Devighat Bridge: The Pipaltar–Pasang Lhamu Highway–Dhamle–Niranjana–Bagkhor–Harre–Deurali–Kolputar route is operational, providing an alternative to the damaged Tadi Khola bridge at Devighat. Maintenance continues.
- Trishuli River Right Bank: The Galchhi–Trishuli Bridge–Kalleritar–Koshikhola–Pimaltar–Darshantar–Chhatre Khola–Gauribesi–Trishuli Bazaar route is operational, connecting communities across the Trishuli River in Nuwakot. Maintenance continues.

7. Suspension Bridges and Rope Crossings

- Rope crossings have been completed at Devighat, Indreni Chaur and Syafrubesi. Installation of two additional crossings at Hakubesi and Pahirebesi is to be expedited.
- Repairs to 20 suspension bridges are targeted for completion within Asoj. Repairs are underway on five bridges, while procurement is progressing for the remaining 15.
- Design and construction tendering for urgently needed new suspension bridges are being expedited.

Temporary Shelter and Housing

- A survey conducted from September 8 to 16 (Bhadra 23 to 31) assessed the temporary housing needs of 2,027 flood-affected households residing in holding centers: among which 1,557 households are in Nuwakot, 397 in Rasuwa, 72 in Dhading, and 1 household in Chitwan.
- Among the surveyed households, 80.6% expressed a preference to reside in government-supported temporary shelters, while 66.9% indicated a willingness to opt for rental housing arrangements supported by the government.
- Only 25.3% of the households reported having their own land available for temporary shelter construction, whereas 8.0% stated that they possess an alternative house outside the flood-affected area.
- A total of 1,776 surveyed households reported complete damage to their houses, 218 reported partial damage, and 33 households reported blocked road access.
- The average household size was 4.77 members. Among those surveyed, households with 3 to 6 members constituted 74.6%, while households with 9 or more members accounted for 5.1%.
- Holding Center (From 28 August / 12 Bhadra to present)



Education Sector

- Thirty-five temporary learning centres or classrooms have been established: 31 in Nuwakot and Dhading and four in Nuwakot.
- Twenty early childhood development and education kits and 36 teacher kits have been distributed.
- A total of 2,359 student learning kits have been distributed to affected students, including those attending private schools.
- Six schools in Dhading have reopened following debris removal, cleaning and disinfection.
- Cleaning and disinfection have covered Ranabhuvaneshwari Secondary School and 13 classrooms at Sulakshana Secondary School, nine classrooms at Bhairum Secondary School in Bidur-8, and Trishuli Basic School.
- Psychosocial support has reached 159 children at Success Academy in Galchhi. Support teams remain mobilized for 31 schools covered by rapid needs assessments, with focal teachers in 16 schools in Rasuwa and Nuwakot.
- Space for temporary learning centres remains insufficient at some school sites. Local governments and schools have been requested to identify safe locations.

Electricity and Energy Restoration

Restoration of Electricity Supply:

- Electricity supply has been fully restored in all areas, except for 46 households in Dahalfedi, Ward No. 1, and 40 households in Lingling, Ward No. 3, of Gosaikunda Rural Municipality, Rasuwa District.
- Solar power systems for alternative energy are being distributed in areas where restoring the electricity supply requires additional time.

Fuel Reserve and Supply Management:

- Nuwakot Station has a reserve stock of 23,000 liters of petrol, 60,000 liters of diesel, and 9,000 liters of aviation fuel.
- A total of 150,000 liters of aviation fuel from Nuwakot Station has been consumed to date for post-Rasuwa flood search, rescue, and relief flights.

Cooking Gas Supply:

- A total of 180 LPG gas cylinders, 110, through private vendors and 70 as subsidized/grant distributions—have been delivered to the affected areas in Rasuwa District.

Communication Sector

- Nepal Telecom reports 117 of 120 BTS towers operational. Its Timure, Chilime Khola and Trishuli 3B sites remain out of service.
- Ncell reports service interruptions at Timure, Tiru, Gatlang and Goljung. Transformer failures have affected the Gatlang and Goljung sites, while Tiru remains affected by a power-supply problem. Nearby operational towers are providing coverage where possible.
- Difficult terrain, damaged infrastructure and power shortages continue to hinder the transport of technical equipment and fuel to affected and remote areas. Helicopter support is required to transport replacement transformers to Gatlang and Goljung and deliver fuel to telecommunications sites without electricity.
- Two telephone lines at the Rasuwa District Emergency Operations Centre and one at the Nuwakot District Emergency Operations Centre have strengthened access to the 1234 emergency hotline.
- Free Wi-Fi internet services are available at the following relief camps and holding centres:
 - Bhairum Secondary School, Hattigauda, Bidur-8.
 - Chandrajyoti Secondary School, Pipaltar, Bidur-5.
 - Trishuli Holding Centre.
 - Mustang Gumba, Swayambhu.
 - Nilkantha School Hostel, Rasuwa.

- Sulakshana School Holding Centre, Bidur-9.
- Of 29 satellite internet terminals arranged for use, 12 have been installed and are operational: one at NDRRMA, seven in Nuwakot and four in Rasuwa.

Health Sector

- Holding-centre health services: Health services cover 27 centres: six in Rasuwa, 15 in Nuwakot, three in Dhading and three in Kathmandu. A cumulative 8,509 services have been recorded, including 848 in the last 24 hours: 80 in Rasuwa, 359 in Nuwakot, 55 in Dhading and 354 in Kathmandu.
- Emergency medical services: Six emergency medical teams remain in the field, comprising five from Nepal APF Hospital and one EPI nurse team. They have managed 8,066 cases, including 71 in the last 24 hours.
- Mental health and psychosocial support: A cumulative 11,251 services have been reported. The district breakdown records 483 services in the latest 24-hour period: 246 in Nuwakot, 97 in Rasuwa, 127 in Dhading and 13 in Kathmandu.
- Disease surveillance: Ten cases were reported in the last 24 hours: six cases of fever with cough, three fever cases and one case of acute gastroenteritis. No fever-with-rash or animal-bite cases were reported. Preparations for influenza rapid testing and public-health monitoring continue.
- Ambulance and emergency transfer services: A NAS ambulance remains on standby for Kathmandu holding centres. A mass-casualty vehicle is stationed at Tribhuvan International Airport, Sinamangal, for emergency transfers.
- Forensic services: Four forensic teams comprising 12 personnel remain active in the field to

examine and manage recovered remains. Cumulative deployment has involved 33 teams and 53 personnel.

- **Disability support and rehabilitation:** A total of 160 persons with disabilities have been identified or assessed in flood-affected areas. More than 220 assistive devices have been distributed, and a disability help desk has been established. Fifty-three people urgently require accessible temporary accommodation and WASH services.
- **Medicines and supplies:** A total of 111,502 units of medicines and health supplies have been dispatched to health facilities, including 108,000 chlorine tablets, 1,000 malaria rapid diagnostic tests, 900 dengue test kits and 700 scrub typhus test kits. One wheelchair has been provided to Nepal Senior Care for flood-affected older people.
- A total of 3,999 individuals have been treated to date by the medical team deployed on behalf of the Nepali Army.

WASH

- **Baireni Bazaar, Galchhi-6:** Drinking-water supply has resumed for approximately 200 households, benefiting more than 550 people. Over 1,700 metres of HDPE pipe, storage tanks and submersible pumps support distribution through the existing network.
- **Water-quality monitoring:** Joint teams have begun testing water at holding centres and from source to tap in Nuwakot and Chitwan. The Bidur water-supply committee has received water-testing equipment and expert support.
- **Emergency water supply:** Three tankers, two with 6,000-litre capacity and one with 9,000-litre capacity, continue delivering safe drinking water to affected areas.
- **Bidur:** A water tank has been installed at Gerkhutar Puchhartol in Ward 10. Tanker deliveries are supporting the Colony area, and a bladder tank has been installed at the temporary camp in Dandachautara.
- A total of 9,500 meters of pipe has been distributed through the Water Supply and Sanitation Division, Nuwakot, to execute various schemes across the Central Jail, Bidur Water Supply Users Association, Kalikhola, and Belkotgadhi areas, where installation and water distribution operations are currently underway.
- **Janasewa Basic School shelter, Belkotgadhi-8:** Improvements include a temporary men's bathing facility with lighting, restoration of a 1,000-litre tank and a handwashing basin, and repairs to taps and plumbing.
- **Chandi Basic School holding centre:** A 6,000-litre tank and water-treatment system have been installed.
- **Bidur water supply:** JICA has provided three additional 100-kVA voltage stabilizers.
- **Siddhalek, Dhading:** Water supply has been arranged for Mahakali Secondary School in Ward 7, serving 400 students, and Jaleshwori Secondary School in Ward 4, serving 249 students.

Continuing Needs and Priorities

- **Search and recovery:** Continue excavation and identification of suspected bodies at Upper Trishuli-1. Maintain safe access, debris management and drainage at Rasuwagadhi, and provide heavy equipment and transport support. Continue identification and dignified management of recovered remains.
- **Roads and bridges:** Complete rock cutting, drainage and debris clearance towards Betrawati. Transport and install bridge components, confirm when the Devighat bridge can open to traffic, and expedite rope crossings at Hakubesi and Pahirebesi.
- **Communications and electricity:** Transport replacement transformers to Gatlang and Goljung, resolve power problems at Tiru, and deliver fuel and equipment to inaccessible telecommunications sites.
- **Education and temporary shelter:** Identify safe sites for additional learning centres where school

space is insufficient. Arrange suitable alternative accommodation for families sheltering in schools, while maintaining learning and psychosocial support for affected children.

- Shelter transition: Update household and holding-centre records, confirm beneficiaries and safe land, and track rental assistance, grant payments, temporary housing and completed relocations.
- Health and protection: Maintain medical services, surveillance, psychosocial support and referrals as families relocate. Prioritize accessible accommodation, safe water, medicines, assistive devices and rehabilitation for people requiring additional support.
- Water and sanitation: Continue water-quality testing and monitor the reliability of restored supplies. Maintain tanker deliveries, storage, treatment, handwashing and bathing facilities at camps and schools.
- Food security and livelihoods: Maintain deliveries to remote communities, resolve cooking-gas shortages and complete pending food procurement. Advance the rapid assessment and address veterinary care, animal feed, safe livestock shelter and agricultural-input needs.
